Re: Code Next Draft, Review Time Extension

Mayor Adler, Mayor Pro Tem Tovo, and Council Members,

The Bouldin Creek Neighborhood Association (BCNA) at its October 10 general association meeting voted by an overwhelming margin to request that the City increase by at least six months the presently scheduled time frame for resident review and comment, re-draft and presentation of drafts 2 and 3 of the CodeNext land development code re-write.

Our residents, who all have busy lives, with work and families to support, find the completely changed terminology, text, meaning and mapping just between drafts 1 and 2 to require an enormous and exhausting expenditure of study and review time before they can even begin to comment.

Furthermore, many questions from residents and review commissions to staff and consultants regarding these drafts have gone unanswered, in seeming disregard to you, the council members who appointed the commissioners, and ultimately to the citizens you and your appointees serve.

We respectfully ask your consideration of this fundamental request in order to enable the goal Mayor Adler has repeatedly espoused, to "get it right." Our city's land development code is too important and impactful on us all NOT to get right. And the citizens who will live under it for years to come should have a reasonable opportunity at voicing what they believe is or is not "right."
